Pick a Park and a Campfire to Warm up to Fall's Cool Weather

The Fairfax County Park Authority is hosting dozens of campfire programs as fall's cool temperatures send that first shiver down your arms. The programs are perfect for both family evenings and date nights.

Riverbend Park, in Great Falls, Va., hosts campfires on Friday evenings at 6 p.m. Naturalists are on hand to talk about nature, and they're also perfectly willing to discuss the best ways to eat the s'mores that they'll offer. Riverbend also hosts a free Toast the Victor Campfire at 4:30 p.m. on Tuesday, November 8, 2016 to announce the winner of the Park Authority's Vote for Your Favorite Herp promotion.

Hidden Oaks Nature Center in Annandale, Va., often holds campfire events, as do several other parks in the county. You'll find a Civil War Soldier theme at a campfire on November 5 and a Coyote Campfire on November 11 at Ellanor C. Lawrence Park in Chantilly, Va. Themed campfires are also held on some Saturday evenings at Burke Lake Park in Fairfax Station, Va. Frying Pan Farm Park, in Herndon, Va., offers adapted campfires that are coupled with wagon rides.
